
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# PrezSez - Evolving Standards by Steve Goldspiel

"How old a car can I buy and still be safe?" The basis of the question asked in Coach Roy Girard's high school Driver's Ed class 55 years ago was economic.

In 1955 a pre World War II car in reasonable condition cost about \$50, which was more than a week's pay at one of our minimum wage jobs. A well used 1947 vehicle went for about \$200 while a brand new Ford V-8 Victoria favored by our rich classmates ran upwards of \$1,800. The question really meant "How much must I spend on a car?"

Mr. Girard, who had coached our high school's football team to state championships and national recognition back when the members of our Class of 1956 were toddlers, responded that he did not like the Model A coupes that some of us were driving. His concern was that the gas tank sat over the driver's lap, behind the minimal dashboard. He feared that in a crash the driver would be immersed in flaming gasoline. (Always ahead of his time, Coach led a successful campaign to have the school's new vending machine stocked with fruit rather than chips and sodas.)

This was back when Ford pioneered a major safety campaign by equipping its cars with dished steering wheels, padded dashboards and sun visors, and seat belt anchors, but not the belts themselves. Those were not vet considered essential.

The lively discussion that ensued lasted the entire 45 minute period. In the end, a consensus was reached that any car we bought should have safety glass all around in case of a crash and hydraulic brakes because we were unlikely to keep pre-war mechanical brakes constantly in adjustment.

Roy Girard's Driver Ed class had no behind the wheel instruction but there was plenty of good discussion about cars and safety.

Although safety features have advanced very significantly since 1955, the basic question remains valid. For daily drivers we may soon be asking whether we need stability control and the new warning systems for blind

spots, lane drift and following too closely. For our antiques, we need to consider how far we should drive in today's traffic in cars that lack air bags, crumple zones, roll over protection, secure door latches and the other engineering improvements of the last 50 years that drivers today take for granted. /Steve/



I was stunned and quite happily surprised when Hugh told me that I received a first place award for the best SDC chapter newsletter for 2010. He told me about an hour before our monthly Black Hawk Chapter club meeting held at Rolf and Becky Snobecks. By the way thank you Rolf and Becky for such an awesome time!! I also learned that I won a second award, The Eleanor Blume Award for best Cover and Artwork for the January – February Dave Reid Memorial issue of the *Starliner*. Quite honestly I was honored and elated. The following is a little background on the Eleanor Blume Award.

Eleanor Blume, who passed away on October 3rd, 2003, designed front covers for Turning Wheels throughout the 1970's and 1980's. Eleanor and her husband Ken, (deceased in 2005 and founder of the Colorado *Conestoga Chapter SDC*) were very involved with SDC since the late 1960's. Eleanor was editor of the Conestoga Chapter newsletter (*The Western Outlook*) for 20



years. After Eleanor Blume passed away, SDC decided to create a yearly award in her memory for SDC editors with the best newsletter cover and artwork. Eleanor had graduated from college in commercial art and offered her artistic talents towards promoting SDC for many many years. There will be more coming on Eleanor Blume in the August Starliner.



Many thanks to all of you who made these two awards possible.

I really owe the entire Black Hawk Chapter a debt of gratitude for showing confidence in me (entrusting me with the Starliner) and I am especially indebted to Dave Reid. Dave's encouragement was critical to me in my producing issue after issue until his death last January. 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## Cover Car - Robert Baker 's Unrestored 1953 Studebaker Commander Starliner Hardtop *Among Raymond Loewy's and Bob Bourke's and South Bend's Finest:* Story and Photos by Don Cuddihee, Jr.







he 1953 Studebaker Loewy/Bourke Coupes and Starliner Hardtops are arguably one of the most beautiful cars in the world and are most certainly one of the most beautiful cars ever made by Studebaker Corporation. Pictured on these pages is an all original (never repainted or restored) 45,000 mile 1953 Studebaker Starliner hardtop.

I was struck like a bolt of lightning when I saw this car at the Antique Automobile Club of America show in Sandwich, Illinois last month and I knew that I had to interview its owner for this month's issue of the Starliner.

After taking numerous photos of the car and jotting down the name and city/state of its owner displayed on the windshield, I telephoned the car's owner, Robert Baker, who graciously allowed me an hour of his time and told me his story behind the purchase of this most magnificent automobile.

Robert Baker of Downers Grove, IL has been a long time admirer of the 1953 Studebaker Starliners and had his eyes open to buy a premium example of one for the past 20 years. His big opportunity came last year when he saw advertised in Turning Wheels an opportunity to purchase a Coral and Ivory 1953 Studebaker that had been literally babied as a "very special car" since new. Robert is now the third cherishing owner of this most beautiful automobile.

Robert explained to me that back when he was sixteen years old, (back around 1960) he bought a used 1953 Champion coupe in the exact same color scheme as the car you see here on these pages – coral and ivory.

Robert was in High School at the time but being that he was underwhelmed with the performance of that little flat head six cylinder engine, he sold the Stude to finance the purchase of a V8 powered Chrysler.

Not long afterwards he regretted ever selling that sleek old Stude and in 1975 Robert purchased a 1962 GT Hawk which he owned until 2001. All along however there was the quest for that "right" - mint condition 1953 Starliner Commander. *Continued*.....







Robert Baker purchased this Studebaker from ninety-one year old, and longtime SDC member, Don Everett of Fraser Michigan who had, up until last year, owned this remarkable car since 1971. Don was the second owner of this Coral and Ivory Starliner and purchased this car from its original owner (Mrs. Henry Just) nearly forty years ago. The Justs purchased this car brand new back in 1953 knowing it was a very "SPECIAL" car and therefore kept the miles to minimum and used the car primarily for pleasure. To say that this car was babied is an understatement.

Robert explained to me that his all original car has its original interior, paint, and mechanicals and that since he has owned it; he has replaced all the hoses, power steering unit and the fuel pump. Having been in the automotive business for most of his life, Robert does all the mechanical work himself. He now owns sixteen classic cars and buys and sells them as a hobby but this one (1953 Starliner) is a definite keeper.

Don Everett supplied Robert with the original build sheet for the car which shows that this Studebaker was ordered on 6-26-53 and was shipped on 7-8-53. The model and body type is THK5CUB. This Starliner hardtop has the following items of optional equipment. They are: tinted glass, power steering, automatic transmission, oil filter, hill holder and climatizer.

When Robert called and spoke with Don's wife Mary about this car, after seeing it in Turning Wheels, she said there had been quite a few people inquiring about it as far away as Australia. There was even a tentative deal on the car that fell through with a gentleman from New York. Robert was prepared when he called about the car. The next day he drove up with a trailer and sealed the deal with Mary and Don and came home with his prize. Don still corresponds with Robert and inquires about his longtime cherished 1953 Starliner.

Robert was a Black Hawk member back in the days when Ron Hall was the Black Hawk Chapter President and I have invited him to attend one of our meeting or events. I hope he does but in any case Robert will be showing this 1953 Commander Starliner more and more in the Chicagoland area so keep a sharp eye open for this "All Original South Bend Beauty". /Don/

Wow!! The Grand Canyon State Chapter of SDC provided us a 46<sup>th</sup> Annual meet in the land of the sun, little rain, and no "rust". Spring sun brought temperatures close to 100 degrees farenheit in the early P.M. but cooled at night and most of the AM. The four star "Renaissance Hotel" was new and provided luxurious space and rooms at an affordable price. Common areas included seminar rooms, meeting rooms, vending, SDC auction, ballroom, hospitality room and the best memorabilia room ever.

Optional tours were available for the Car Rallye, Desert Botanical Gardens, Gold King Mine, Frank Lloyd Wright Taliesin West, and Grand Canyon Tour, etc. It was my privilege to have

an old neighbor, from Naperville, IL, drive me to Jerome, Arizona to tour Gold King Mine and the Ghost Town Machining & Auto museum. To see the Ghost Town Machining & Auto Museum is a special treat for "STUDE" lovers because of the extensive collection of STUDE cars and trucks strewn over the side of a mountain and the abandoned copper mine. Proprietor, Don Robertson, owns the property and has assembled a great collection of some mint STUDE cars and trucks. Especially notable were the 1902 STUDE ELECTRIC, 1913 TOURING SEDAN, and the 1928 PRESIDENT "BIG SIX" race car. If you are ever in the Phoenix area, try to spend up to one full day touring this historic museum in Jerome, AZ. Oh! and did I mention the demonstration of a large log sawing machine; early gas operated 127 KW generator and the 1915 rebuilt PACKARD logging truck (BRASS RADIATOR)?

Back at the Renaissance Hotel a huge MEDIA CENTER room was devoted to vendors, SWAP MEET, display of original STUDE horse drawn, electric and gasoline vehicles, etc. As you entered the huge ballroom, you beheld the restored 1925 Arizona "SHERIFF TOURING STUDEBAKER". Twelve (12) of these cars were supplied to the various counties in Arizona in 1925 to maintain law and order. In honor of the Arizona Sheriffs who used the STUDES to maintain law and order in the 1920's, the five passenger "BIG SIX" DUPLEX – PHAETON was named "THE SHERIFF". Therefore this car was honored to represent STUDEBAKER's fine contribution to the state of Arizona. *Continued.....*
